ECO-ADVENTURE: THE ENVIRONMENTAL TRIVIA BOARD GAME

Game instructions p.1

Welcome to Eco-Adventure! Your mission is to become an Environmental Champion by answering questions, completing challenges, and learning about our amazing planet. The first player to reach the finish line wins and earns the title of "Earth Guardian"!

Materials Needed - Summary

- **Game board:** Create using a large piece of cardboard or poster board. (follow the instructions on how to build the game board)
- **Question cards:** Write questions on recycled paper or index cards. (follow the instructions on how to create the cards)
- **Wooden or recycled plastic tokens:** Representing the Eco Heroes (e.g. plastic caps of water bottles or fizzy drinks etc. – follow the instructions provided to build them).
- **Dice:** Borrow from another game or make your own (follow the instructions).
- **Score sheets:** Use scrap paper to keep track of points in case of multiple game batches.

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Categories and Questions

Our trivia questions are divided into four exciting categories:

1. **Key environmental issues**
2. **European and International Policies**
3. **Consequences of Political Inaction**
4. **Climate Activism**
5. **Solutions Towards Climate Change**

- *Players can choose to include questions from only one, two, three, four, or all five categories.*

Furthermore, to make it more fun there will also be cards with **fun facts** and some environment related **challenges** the players either can be decided collectively or choose from the predefined challenges. Hence, while the players will be designing the game board, do not forget to dedicate a few spaces (as many as they decide) for the ECO – challengers and some “Lose your turn” sections.

Setting Up the Game

1. **Create the Game Board:** Draw a path with different coloured spaces on your cardboard. Mark the start and finish points. Decorate the board with eco-friendly themes like trees, animals, and recycling symbols. Follow the instructions to build the game board
2. **Prepare the Question Cards:** Assign someone to write down the preassigned questions on little cards, the challenges, and the fun fact cards. Mix each category for variety.
3. **Choose Game Tokens:** When you are done with creating your tokens, place them all at the start point.
4. **Decide on the Turn Order:** Roll the dice to see who goes first. The highest roll starts the game!

Gameplay Instructions

Setup: Unfold the game board and place it in the center of the playing area. Each player selects an Eco Hero token and places it on the starting space. Shuffle the deck of challenge cards and place them face down on the designated space on the board. Place the dice within reach of all players.

Rolling the Dice: On your turn, roll the dice and move your game piece forward the number of spaces shown.

Turn Sequence: Players take turns moving their Eco Hero token around the board according to the roll of the dice. As they move, they encounter various questions and challenges, represented by drawing cards from each question category deck, as well as the challenge deck.



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Landing on a section:

- **Green section:** Draw a question card from your chosen category (or categories). If you answer correctly, roll again! If you answer incorrectly, your turn ends. By the end of the question, please place the card at the end of the deck.
- **Blue section:** Complete a fun eco-challenge. Players can decide among them regarding the challenge, or you can find a list with some preassigned challenge ideas.
- **Red section:** Lose a turn. Reflect on how every action impacts the environment and think of one way to improve! Take one card from the "Fun facts" deck and read it out loud!
- **Special sections:** Some spaces may have specific instructions like "Go back 2 spaces" or "Jump ahead 2 spaces", follow these instructions!

Answer Checking: After a player answers a question, all players can check together to see if the answer is correct using the answer key provided on the opposite side of the card with the question. This encourages teamwork and co-learning.

Victory Conditions: The game ends when players successfully answer all questions and complete all the challenges. Victory is achieved by reaching the starting point and the player who succeeds it first is the winner.

Reflection: After the game, take time to reflect on the themes and messages conveyed. Discuss real-world environmental issues and brainstorm ways to take action in your community.



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Tips for a Fun Game

- Encourage teamwork and discussion about the questions.
- Be creative with your eco-challenges to keep the game exciting.
- Remember, the goal is to learn and have fun together while thinking about how we can all help the planet.

- **Question:** What are the three R's of recycling? (Answer: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle)
- **Challenge:** Name three items that can be composted.
- **Fun Fact:** Did you know that recycling one aluminium can save enough energy to run a TV for three hours?
